OVERALL DEVELOPMENTAL APPROACH

Thank you for the completed application form and map outlining the work in which the Moyne Tidy Towns Committee is involved. Moyne is a pleasant village and it is good to see that its residents are anxious to maintain and improve the fabric of their home place. We note that you have the assistance of FAS and that you liaise with the Local Authority regarding projects being undertaken.

THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT

The Church, the School and the Mid-Western Health Board buildings are all well presented. The window boxes at the latter gave a colourful display. What appeared to be a Garda Station is rather a stark building - could this be "softened" somewhat with planting? The telephone box needed to be painted. Most business premises were presented well in the village.

LANDSCAPING

The grassed areas and tree planting on the approach roads were noted and also some good planting throughout the village, especially opposite the School. The Grotto was very well maintained and also the graveyard. Tubs and hanging baskets play a large part in making Moyne a pleasant place to visit.

WILDLIFE AND NATURAL AMENITIES

Encouraging wildlife through the protection of habitats in hedgerows is commendable.

We also noted that you breed pheasants and release them into the wild.

LITTER CONTROL

Moyne did not have much of a litter problem on the day of adjudication and litter bins were strategically placed.

TIDINESS

There were a couple of rather untidy areas but overall the village is fairly neat and tidy with no kerbside weeds.

RESIDENTIAL AREAS

Private houses are prevalent in Moyne and the owners are contributing to the Tidy Towns effort.

ROADS, STREETS AND BACK AREAS

These were mainly well maintained and we note your work in connection with footpaths as per the diagram sent in with application form. On the Templetuohy approach the village name sign needed to be cleaned, as did the signage in the centre of the village.

GENERAL IMPRESSION

The Committee continues to work for the good of the village and appears to be bringing the whole community along with them in their endeavours. Well done.
