OVERALL DEVELOPMENTAL APPROACH

Welcome to this years Tidy Towns competition. Thank you for your entry form, village map, Integrated Local Development plan and lots of additional information. You set yourselves clear priorities and have many achievements after the year. Well Done.

THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT

The new footpath and lighting from Featherstones pub to the GAA pitch enhance the approach from the Glenamaddy side, and when the resurfacing of the carpark is completed it will further improve the visual impact. The Bilingual Stone sign for Creggs are noted. The resurfaced car-parking area beside SPAR shop and new stone wall is a big improvement. The Presbyterian Church Ruin, stands out for all the wrong reasons, I note your commitment to trim the grass, however, this had not taken place when I visited. The Charles Stuart Parnell which was professionally cleaned looks well and provides a focal point at the round-about.

LANDSCAPING

The Shrub bed in front of School is a credit to the children of Creggs, and I note their various bulbs in full bloom by the school door. There many flower beds, boxes and hanging baskets in the village that look well. The ivy on the GAA wall is growing nicely. The Ruby Club Car-park had quite a few weeks but they were sprayed off. Watch out for grass and weeds at base of walls and kerbs.

WILDLIFE AND NATURAL AMENITIES

The wildlife area is a wonderful project and well done to all involved. Also Congrats to Creggs N.S. on achieving the Green Flag Award.

LITTER CONTROL

Nice to see Recycling bins in place, and new bin on school grounds. There was some litter in evidence around the recycling area and also on the main street not to far from Spar Shop.
