2018 Winner

Last year in 2018 we celebrated the 60th anniversary of the |SuperValu TidyTowns competition and out of the record number of 883 entries, Listowel were crowned Ireland's Tidiest Town.

To mark their achievement the President of Ireland Michael D. Higgins and his wife Sabina paid a visit to Listowel recently and unveiled a plaque to commemorate their wonderful achievement.





Great crowds turned out in the town square to give the Presidential party a hearty Kerry welcome and St. John's Theatre and Arts Centre was packed to the rafters to hear the wonderful speech form President Higgins. Afterwards the plaque which is set in a special piece sculpted by local sculptor Darren Enright was unveiled. Refreshments were served in the Kerry Writers Museum and a specially made cake for the event was enjoyed by all. Well done to Listowel TidyTowns and Kerry County Council for their organisation and welcome for everyone.
