The sculpture was erected in the same place where a blacksmith used to be up until the late 1970's Paddy Hogan was his name. They was also a horse shod in the church carpark and many old games took place.

There was a heritage quiz on the Friday night; heritage walks on the Saturday and Sunday with traditional music in the local bars each night.

The local GAA also unveiled a wall with names on it that was created to pay for an astro turf field.

- Photographs should not contain close up images of other people unless you have received their permission to take and submit the photograph to this competition.
- The TidyTowns Unit will judge all entries and prizes will be awarded as above.
- The TidyTowns Unit may use photographs submitted for social media or publications going forward.
- The closing date for entries is Friday November 25th.
- Results will be announced on Social Media and in the December Newsletter.
- Prizes will issue as soon as possible but it may be in January 2023.







# Kilsheelan TidyTowns does Botanical Art

In early Summer, an ecologist, Mieke Brosnan, who had previously done assessments of our Biodiversity habitats reached out to engage our group and other interested parties in doing a "Creative Ireland" & Tipperary County Council funded Botanical Art study of the flora of the River Suir in Kilsheelan

Tutored by Mary Dillon a Kilkenny based Botanical Artist, Mieke set out to capture the common and unique plants residing along our section of the River Suir, which is a protected SAC. Particular attention was paid to the micro detail of a flower, which is often hidden on first inspection



We believe this is a first for any TidyTowns group. This Creative Ireland Botanical Art project involved 5 workshops of studying plants on the River and having drawing workshops afterwards



It will eventually lead to Kilsheelan TidyTowns installing a permanent Lectern display of the drawings and descriptions of this flora, personalised by the drawings of Mieke.

Highlights were engaging our members but also interested people from other groups, one of the days was listed as a Heritage Week walk on official calendar in August and a rare plant Butomus umbellatus was identified which is now recorded to National Biodiversity Data Centre in Waterford. Two Alien species were identified, one of which was new to us

This project engages, educates and raises community awareness of the Biodiversity in our environment.

The images above show attendees studying Plants along River Suir Blueway – and also drawing Plants in Kilsheelan Community Hall. The group feel that this project was a first of its kind for a TidyTowns group and it was a big success for their group and new people attracted to the study and art workshops.


Well done to Kilsheelan TidyTowns for your efforts in organising this event.

### Entente Florale 2022

Last Month TidyTowns groups from Keadue in Roscommon and Dalkey in Dublin made their way to Balatonfüred in Hungary for the 2022 Entente Florale prize giving ceremony. Each year we nominate a village and a town entrant to represent Ireland on the European stage.



Our entrants perform exceptionally well in this competition each year and this year was no different. Keadue were awarded a Gold medal and Dalkey were awarded a Silver medal.



Both entrants were also recipients of a Special Characteristic Prize, Dalkey were commended for the conservation strategy for Dalkey Island. The Jury were impressed with the outstanding conservation work on Dalkey Island and the work of Dalkey TidyTowns Committee on their unique Energy Plan.

Keadue were applauded for the maintenance of their Heritage Park. The special approach of the Heritage Park

maintenance, including the integration of wildlife meadows pleased the judges especially the presence of wild orchids in the park on the day the jury visited the village.



Congratulations to both Dalkey and Keadue on your wonderful results and thank you for accepting the nominations to represent your towns and villages, your county and indeed the county in this prestigious competition.

Thank you also to the Local Authority officials in Roscommon and Dun Laoghaire Rathdown for their tremendous support and to the local businesses, community groups, residents, schools and all who supported you in the competition and to the TidyTowns mentors who helped you along the way. ### **Cobh TidyTowns - Garden of Reflection**



Having won the 2021 TidyTowns Covid Community Spirit Award acknowledging the breadth of work done by community groups, individuals and businesses in Cobh inspired the group to start planning a project to remember all the positivity in the town during this time and reflect on those who are no longer with us. The Cobh Garden of Reflection is a Cobh TidyTowns initiative in association with Cobh Parish. The enhancements to the area invite us to reflect, rest and remember the Covid 19 pandemic.

The garden honours those who have sadly passed away, celebrates the community spirit and hard work of the community and reminds us of how rich Cobh is with so many places and experiences to enjoy on our Great Island.

Once Bishop Crean and the Parish Pastoral Council gave their



blessing, the planning for the Cobh Covid Garden of Reflection began in earnest. An area that previously was just grass was enhanced with wheelchair accessible paving, pollinator planted flowerbed with some interesting engraved stone as well as seats to take in the harbour and listen to the Cathedral Carrillon recitals.



When you visit the garden you will see many inspirational quotes set amongst the beautiful flowers – you'll see one from the Bible but you'll see others from Kurt Cobain, Martin Luther King Jr., Charlie Mackesy, Helen Keller, Robin Williams, Emma Donoghue and many more.

The one with particular relevance to this project is one from Fred Rogers: 'Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping' – and there were quite a few helpers.

Bishop Crean saw how this underutilised green area will make Cobh an even better place to live in, work in and to visit and enhance the lives of people living here. In his own words it was a "no brainer" to do something with the space.



The people of Cobh have supported Cobh TidyTowns for over 40 years but over the past 13 years the town has been transformed by a community wide effort to make Cobh a place that we are all proud to call home. By scooping so many awards with prize money in 2021, along with community support by buying our fundraising calendar, the support of our sponsors, those who have fundraised for us and a contribution from the Cobh Chronicle we were able to fund this project fully and give back with added value to the people of Cobh.
